Regulatory Update 2024 for Agrochemicals

- Compliance programmes to allow task forces and consortia established for regulation purposes under different chemical regimes to comply with the EU sanctions on Russia.
- Consortia, SIEFs and task forces (under REACH or other regulations) to comply with European Union sanctions and data sharing between chemical companies
- How European consortia should comply with EU sanctions when providing access to registrants under other jurisdictions (for instance in Turkey or South Korea)
